We have successfully closed our 2025 fiscal year exceeding expectations. I am preparing the files for the trustees in hopes the audit can be completed prior to spring break.

Dues Report:

On the 10th of each month, we received the dues deposit from the employer for the previous month.

November 30, 2025, SD36 dues report shows:

- 5529 unique employee numbers
- 27 newly initiated members
- 4636 total members that paid dues
- 1294 have a 37.5-hour work week.
